Amma Vodi -

A dream come true

Amma Vodi was conceived by His Holiness Sri Ganapathi Sachchidananda Swamiji and has been built under his divine blessings. Spread over a



sprawling 2 acres of landscaped greenery, in Dindigal, near Hyderabad in Andhra Pradesh, this facility was inaugurated on 14th October 2004, by His Excellency Mr. S.S. Barnala, Governor, Andhra Pradesh. It can rehabilitate and accommodate around 200 needy women. Every single facility that was planned in order to make Amma Vodi a true haven has been created with love and an eye for detail. There is a 60-room dormitory that can accommodate about 200 residents, hygienic kitchens with an attached dining hall where over 100 of the residents can eat at a time, a utility block with sophisticated laundry machinery (and an entire floor devoted to drying clothes in the rainy season), a generator room that houses a generator for captive power, a congregation hall, a recreation / library section and also an attendants block which can comfortably accommodate 18 people in six living quarters.

Built at a cost of over Rs. 30 million, Amma Vodi is now open and functioning as a full-fledged home for destitute women aged above 60 years. Its serene landscaped environs and calm interiors provide these deserving women a much-needed haven to enjoy the winters of their lives in calm and peace.
